Treasurer's Report on 2023

The Prairie Club continues to be in a strong financial position. We ended the year 2023 with approximately \$504,300 of cash and investments, of which \$267,900 is unrestricted and \$236,400 has been reserved for future long-term capital improvements and other uses. The Club does not have any debt except for routine expenses in the process of being paid.

The net profit for the year (after the depreciation charge) was net income of \$30,358 compared to net income in 2022 of \$63,809, a decrease of \$33,451.

The Club's tax return (Form 990) for 2023 was filed on a timely basis with the IRS.



Spring Grove Report

The purpose of this report is to wrap up 2023 and preview 2024 at the Spring Grove camp. We finished the 2023 season strong with maximum site occupancy and a positive budget. Our main challenges continue to be increased utility costs, taxes, and insurance costs. We helped to offset those costs with a successful golf outing fundraiser.

We were able to utilize the Spring Grove improvement fund to purchase gravel to rebuild our aging lowland road. The labor for grading, spreading and steam rolling the road was provided free of charge by site holder Bruce Buschick and his family. We plan to expand that project to include rebuilding the remaining roads this coming season.

A generous \$1000 donation to the SG conservation fund by long time site holder Cathy Halfpenny will be used to plant trees throughout the property. As part of a new initiative to monitor and hopefully reduce our electric costs we purchased and are in the process of installing electric meters on all the trailer site power pedestals.

As we continue to operate at full occupancy in 2024, for the first time, we now have developed a waiting list for the next available trailer site! A huge thank you to our SG Lodge committee woman and board member Mickey Hanson who always goes above and beyond to ensure the lodge is clean and ready for use.

If you have never visited SG, I invite you to come check out the beautiful lodge and spring fed pond or traverse the beautiful Nippersink Creek which winds throughout the property. Spring Grove is a great place for a family reunion or weekend getaway. We also offer weekend camping or tent sites. I hope to see you soon.

We did our annual Spring cleaning in April and May which involved: carpet and upholstery cleaning, a deep cleaning of the whole house by DeeAnna, laundering of mattress pads, pillow protectors, bedspreads, and blankets. Stained towels and sheets were replaced. Windows were washed both inside and out.

We are looking forward to the time when the new screened porch can be started. We are hoping to start construction in the next year, but nothing has been finalized yet. The process has been delayed due to other priority projects at Buena Vista and the Family Cottage which have been expensive.

A special thank you to DeeAnna, Natalie and Vern for all the time and energy spent to help the farmhouse run smoothly. DeeAnna keeps up with the busy cleaning schedule especially during peak season. Vern's expertise in fixing things that go wrong in the farmhouse is invaluable.
