**THE PRAIRIE CLUB 117<sup>TH</sup> ANNUAL MEETING  
MAY 31, 2025**

**Call to Order.** President Mike Maloney called to order a regularly scheduled Annual meeting of the Prairie Club at 11:41 am pm (EDT) on May 31, 2025.

**Meeting materials.** Attendees were provided a handout that included a meeting agenda, a list of the current Prairie Club officers, board of directors and committee chairs, an audit report, the Treasurer's report, membership counts, lists of departed and 2024 new members, and reports from the Hazelhurst and Spring Grove camp chairs, the respective rental chairs for the Buena Vista, Family Cottage, and Farmhouse rental facilities as well as reports of the Activities and the Conservation Committees. The Membership Committee report included information on rules related to Hazelhurst access. See the handout for details reported by Committee Chairs.

**President's Comments.** President Mike Maloney opened the meeting by noting the long history of volunteerism in in the Club and that the organization could not operate without substantial volunteer efforts. He also noted that the Club is doing exceptionally well, with strong membership and financial capacity. Activities are happening regularly. Facilities have been upgraded and are in excellent condition; Mike specifically noted the new roof on the Hazelhurst Farmhouse.

Mike thanked Barb Burton for two outstanding years as Hazelhurst Camp Chair and reported that Dan Gapen will be succeeding Barb in August. Finally, Mike thanked Hope Little for organizing the meeting and picnic.

Mike asked for a motion to approve the minutes of the Mike 2024 Meeting. Doug Elrick made the motion, it was seconded and carried.

**Treasurer Report.** Mark Sever, the Prairie Club Treasurer, presented a summary of the Prairie Club's financial status. A one-page summary of the 2024 operating results was included in the annual meeting packet.

Mark Sever noted the Prairie Club is in a solid financial position with strong operating earnings and a solid balance sheet. Mark Sever referred to the financial summary in the annual meeting materials if members wanted more details. He was also available for questions if members wanted more information.

The Prairie Club has filed its Form 990 tax return on a timely basis to maintain our tax-exempt status. Charles Manthey has completed his financial review of the 2024 books and records. His report is included in the meeting materials.

Given the Prairie Club's financial position and actual and budgeted operating results for 2025, Mark Sever indicated he had discussed with the Board at the May Board meeting if a dues increase was needed for 2026. The Board did not raise dues for 2024 or 2025. Given the Prairie Club's financial position and with the caveat that nothing significant occurs in the remainder of the year, the Board's view was that no increase in dues would be needed for 2026.

**Departed Members.** Hope Little read the list of members who passed away since the last Annual Meeting. The list is included in the meeting materials.

**Raffle.** The meeting closed with a raffle. Congratulations to four lucky members who won either a Prairie Club ball cap or mug.

**Adjournment.** The meeting was adjourned by President Mike Maloney at 11:58 am (EDT).

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## **2025 Audit Report**

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I have completed the independent review of the financial books and records of The Prairie Club for fiscal year 2025. A review does not constitute an audit, thus, the assurance that the financial statements are free of misrepresentations is limited. The use of QuickBooks greatly aids the review and essentially 90% of the transactions were reviewed. The Month of May was chosen for an in-depth review. According to the Policies and Procedures Manual, a number of routine internal reports along with filing tax returns and reviewing the insurance policies were accomplished.

I have found no material misstatements and recommend no modifications to the financial statements. The review found the books to be clear and comprehensible, the supporting documentation to be well-organized and the administration of financial activities to be in adherence with The Prairie Club's Accounting Policies and Procedures Manual March 2026. This review was done remotely.

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## **Treasurer's Report on 2025**

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The Prairie Club continues to be in a strong financial position. The Club ended the year 2025 with approximately \$739,607 of cash and investments, of which \$319,158 is unrestricted and \$420,449 has been reserved for future long-term capital improvements and other uses. The Club does not have any debt except for routine expenses in the process of being paid.

The net profit for the year (after the depreciation charge) was net income of \$80,283 compared to net income in 2024 of \$73,047, an increase of \$7,236.

The Club's tax return (Form 990) for 2025 was filed on a timely basis with the IRS.

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# Conservation Committee Report

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The Prairie Club continued its annual contribution in 2025 to two conservation organizations near our camps: Chikaming Open Lands (COL) in southwest Michigan and the Nippersink Watershed Association (NWA) in McHenry County, Illinois.

Chikaming Open Lands is dedicated to preserving open space and the diverse natural character of southwest Berrien County.

The Nippersink Watershed Association conserves, protects and renovates the Nippersink Creek watershed in Illinois and Wisconsin.

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# Membership Committee Report

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In 2025, the membership committee approved 14 new members, with the total membership at 897 at year end.

In 2025 the Membership Committee began discussions in response to a significant and unprecedented increase in membership applications and the challenges that accompanied this growth—particularly regarding misunderstanding of membership privileges, misuse of sponsorship privileges, and limited access to Camp Hazelhurst due to capacity constraints. As a result, the committee recommended implementing a temporary pause on new membership applications, which the Board subsequently approved on October 2025.

During this pause, the membership-related sections of the website were carefully reviewed and updated. In addition, the application form, Sponsor Guide, and Sponsor Forms were revised. These changes were made with the goal of reinforcing the vital role that sponsors play in shaping the future of the Prairie Club.

The Prairie Club website has been redesigned to make it more user friendly when accessing information and forms regarding the membership process. Please be aware of all current sponsorship rules and guidelines, including recent policy revisions related to the sponsorship of new members. Providing false or misleading information, or misusing sponsorship rules, guidelines, or policies, will result in the revocation of sponsorship privileges and may be reported to the Prairie Club Board.

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# Hazelhurst Report

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We welcomed two “new” siteholders in 2025, Anne Walker and Maria von Meding.

The camp and the club created and passed a new 10-year lease, with Nelson Pelletier, Mark Sever, and Sarah Craig Pratt contributing significant edits throughout the process. A tennis court crack fill/repair and resurfacing project proposed by Lisa Pratt and Charlie Johnson was approved and started. Invasive removal behind the beach bathroom was completed and an army of volunteers led by Sharon Lemler began planting desired vegetation.

We had six new committee chairs make contributions to the camp in 2025. Doug Elrick took on the 4th of July picnic and got the youth of the camp involved reading the Declaration of Independence and the reading of Paul Revere’s ride, which had its 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary. Becky Johnson volunteered to be our community liaison and represented our camp in Chikaming Township master plan updates and Chikaming Township board meetings regarding short term rentals.
